Groups of no more than 30 including coaches will be in place (although two or more groups may be present at the same time all with coaches (including being in line with safeguarding requirements) A brief will be held upon arrival detailing the contents of this Risk Assessment as well as the details of the session or Match to ensure the information around COVID-19 and control measures to stop exposure are refreshed and up to date. Records of participants will be held to aid the NHS Track and Trace system with all records held for a minimum of 14 days in line with isolation requirements. First aid will be kept to a minimum with it only being given in situations to preserve life or serious injury and then with gloves, face coverings and overalls or similar body protection.	3	6	18

Coaches, officials and Players	5	6	30	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Single use PPE should be disposed of so that it cannot be reused and reusable PPE cleaned after use and prior to wearing and not shared; • Equipment will be cleaned with anti-bacterial cleaning cloths or solution prior to, during breaks and after completion of the training session or Match • Bibs are not to be worn unless they have been cleaned before each use with people asked to bring different coloured tops and playing kit to avoid the need for bibs during warm ups and training • Hand cleaning facilities will be made available within the clubhouse toilets • Players to bring named hand sanitiser for themselves along with a named water bottle for use • Players are not to touch equipment with their hands – coaches will issue and establish all equipment such as goals and corner flags <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For Matches sanitised balls will be located on cones surrounding the pitch and are to only be retrieved by players and not supporters. Further toilets are available for the clubhouse but only in line with the separate risk assessment for the bar and club with a strict one way system. • Enhanced cleaning regimes for toilet and changing rooms particularly door handles, locks and toilet flush: prior to start and after finishing. • Disposable hand towels to be used with bins available for immediate disposal • Wherever possible players and officials should come changed and ready with showers and changing taking place at home <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If changing rooms are required then the teams must use them in accordance with 2m social distancing requirements and showers are not to be used. • For adult teams kits will be washed prior to each use and one person responsible for cleaning and issue. 	3	6	18
